Environmental Scanning

A process used by modern fire departments (organizations) to monitor important aspects of the environment wherein they operate.



SWOT Analysis

- Strengths
- Weaknesses
- Opportunities
- Threats



Strengths

An advantage or distinction of the **organization** from which the organization can gain a potential benefit – Something they are really good at



Strengths

- 1. A skill
- 2. Special expertise
- 3. Valued assets
- 4. Special capabilities



Weakness

A disadvantage or limitation of the organization from which the organization can suffer potential harm. Something they lack, or do poorly



Weaknesses

- 1. Missing skills
- 2. Missing equipment or assets
- 3. Lack of training
- 4. Failure to have a mission



Opportunities

A positive situation in the environment of the organization from which the organization can potentially benefit – Doing what it does best, as good as it possibly can



Threats

A negative situation in the environment of the organization from which it can potentially suffer harm.

Recommending a Strategy

How can you possibly reach the future unless you understand the present?

Vision Statement

- State the vision
- State the long term direction

What is Your Mission Statement?

- What is it that you do?
- Why do you exist?
- What might you want to do?

Goals and Objective

- State the desired goal
- State the desired objective
- Use multiple points if necessary

Today's Situation

- Summary of the current situation
- Use brief bullets, discuss details verbally

How Did We Get Here?

- Any relevant historical information
- Original assumptions that are no longer valid

Available Options

- State the alternative strategies
- List the advantages and disadvantages of each available strategic option
- State cost of each option

Recommendations

- Recommend one or more of the strategies
- Summarize the results if things go as proposed
- What to do next
- Identify Action Items
